- Inhaled colostrum and lavender essential oil both help relieve pain in neonates undergoing frenotomy, with no observed side effects.
- Neonates exposed to inhaled colostrum showed a slightly shorter crying time compared to those exposed to lavender essential oil, though the difference was not statistically significant.
- Both treatments resulted in similar Neonatal Infant Pain Scale (NIPS) scores, indicating comparable pain relief effectiveness.
- The study suggests that while both colostrum and lavender essential oil are safe and effective for pain relief during frenotomy, lavender essential oil remains the preferred choice due to its ease of availability and quick application.
- The study highlights the potential of familiar scents, such as colostrum, in reducing neonatal pain, though further research is needed to fully understand the mechanisms involved.






